	<p style="text-align: center;">709.1. EXCLUSION OF PERSONS FROM SCHOOL PROPERTY</p> <p>1. Purpose It is the desire of the Northern Lebanon Board to make available school facilities to individuals and organizations. The Board further encourages citizens to attend, support, and enjoy the many activities that are conducted on school property. At the same time, the Board acknowledges its responsibility to maintain a healthy, safe, and orderly environment in which these activities can be conducted.</p> <p>2. Authority In order to provide a healthy, safe, and orderly environment, the Board sets forth the following guidelines for the exclusion of persons who would create situations not in keeping with the purpose of this policy.</p> <p>3. Guidelines Persons who have committed a variety of offenses on school property may be excluded from school property. Persons eligible for exclusion are those who:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Are suspected drug dealers.</li> <li>2. Have committed acts of assault and/or battery against other persons.</li> <li>3. Have unlawfully taken or have attempted to unlawfully take money, valuables, clothing, personal belongings and/or other items by means of burglary, larceny, stealing, theft, robbery and/or extortion.</li> <li>4. Have endangered other persons by driving recklessly and/or by creating situations which threaten the health, safety, and welfare of others.</li> <li>5. Are in possession of weapons, drugs, and/or alcohol.</li> <li>6. Have failed to comply with legitimate requests from school district personnel to leave the school premises because of engaging in disorderly conduct or unreasonably interrupting the educational process.</li> <li>7. Have committed arson, breaking and entering, malicious mischief, vandalizing school property and/or any other act, deliberate or accidental, which causes damage to school property.</li> </ol>
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8. Are under a court issued restraining order protecting a student or employee.
9. Have committed harassment, sexual harassment, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, threats, intimidation, inciting to riot, disorderly conduct, malicious injury, mayhem, moral turpitude, and/or any other act which creates a breach of the peace.
10. Have committed any misdemeanor or felony.

This policy is not intended to limit freedom of speech on school property and the policy cannot be used for this purpose.

The Superintendent shall be responsible for developing procedures for implementing the provisions of this policy.
